Cyber attacks are constantly evolving, with new fraudulent emails, fake logins and attempts to misuse accounts. Therefore, it is important to monitor the current security alerts and follow the recommendations of experts from the Information and Communication Technologies, Charles University.

What to look out for right now

Typically, the following forms of attack occur:

Phishing emails – pretend to be messages from a university, bank or postal service.

Fake login pages – imitate CAS or Microsoft 365.

Fraudulent SMS and phone calls – posing as IT support or faculty management.

Malware – harmful attachments in emails that infect devices when opened.

Recommendations



Never click on links in suspicious emails.

If you are not sure, forward the message to IT support.

Regularly follow the ICT warnings – it will help you recognize an attack before it happens.
